There is already a shortage in students wanting to work for arms companies; by taking action against BAE you will be directly affecting their ability to thrive as weapons producers.

Counter-recruitment actions work! In 2008 energy manufacturers E.ON pulled out of their graduate recruitment tour following constant protests at the universities they visited.

In July 2010 it was reported that the skills needed for the aerospace industry may soon be in short supply. This means that arms companies are already having difficulty recruiting, which makes the campaign to BAN BAE achievable.
